Your itinerary*

Monday, October 4: Our pilgrimage begins as we depart from our local airport for an overnight flight to Rome, Italy.

Tuesday,October 5: Upon arrival in Rome, we'll be greeted by our Canterbury tour manager and will stop by the hotel or religious house before an afternoon walk to explore the Velabro, where Romulus and Remus were raised by the Palatine Wolf. We will visit San Giorgio in Velabro (venerate the relics of Sts. Sebastian and George) and Santa Maria in Cosmedin (relics of St. Valentine). If time allows, we will also see the best-preserved buildings of Rome's Republic era: The Forum Boarium, the ruins of the Largo Argentina, the Portico of Octavia, the Jewish Ghetto, and the Theater of Marcellus. We enjoy a welcome reception, supper on our own, and have the remainder of the evening to rest. the evening to rest.

Wednesday, October 6: After breakfast, we're off to Saint Peter's Square for the general audience with the Holy Father (subject to the Pope's schedule). Following a lunch break, we'll visit St. Peter's Basilica, venerate Blessed Peter at his Tomb, and venerate other saints (St. Jospahat) buried in the Basilica, built on the site where St. Peter, the chief apostle, died a martyr and was buried in 64 AD. We walk back to our hotel by way of The Via Pellegrini (The Way of the Pilgrims) and see Castel Sant'Angelo, Ponte Sant'Angelo, and step into The Chiesa Nuova – St. Philip Neri's Church. We enjoy Mass together this evening and a group supper evening and a group supper.

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Thursday, October 7: Following breakfast – for those not attending the Lepanto Congress – we begin the day walking of the Centro Storico, the Historic Center of Rome. Depending on the MIC's schedule at the Congress, one of our Chaplains may celebrate Mass at San Luigi dei Francesi, followed by a visit St. Agostino, where St. Monica rests, and The Jesu, the Jesuit Church in Rome, home to the right arm of Francis Xavier. Following a generous break for lunch we will visit the Pantheon and Santa Maria Sopra Minerva where Galileo was tried, and where (some of!) St. Catherine of Siena rests. Depending on the time of holy Mass to be sung by the MIC in the chapel of St. Pius V at St. Mary Major Basilica, we'll walk back to our hotel by way of three of Rome's most famous piazzas: the Piazza Navona, the Piazza Farnese, and the Campo de Fiori. Group dinner.

Friday, October 8: Following breakfast, we will depart the hotel by bus and have Mass at the Church of St. Agnes Outside the Walls where her bones are kept. We will also see one of the less busy catacombs in Rome, a foundation of one of the earliest Constantinian basilicas. Next, we will visit St. Lawrence Outside the Walls which is home of the relics of Justin Martyr, St. Lawrence, and Blsd. Pius IX. After a group lunch we will visit Santa Croce in Gerusalemme built over the home of Constantine's mother, St. Helena, where the Passion Relics reside. Highlight of the day will be the veneration of St. Paul in the Basilica Outside the Walls. Time permitting, we'll conclude the day's visits with the oldest church in Rome, St. John Lateran, and have a chance to climb

the Scala Sancta, the steps from Pontius Pilate's palace brought to Rome by St. Helena. Independent supper.

Saturday, October 9: Today we will walk to the one of the loveliest and quietest parts of Rome, the Caelian Hill. On our way, we will pass the Circus Maximus viewing to our left and the Palatine Hill. Following Mass at Santi Giovanni e Paulo we will explore the Roman houses beneath this church before visiting Santi Quattro Corinati including the Capella San Sylvestro and the Cloister. Next we'll see San Stefano Rotunda. After a group lunch, we will visit San Clemente and its excavations. Pilgrims who wish to visit the Flavian Amphitheater (Colosseum), the nearby house church of Ss. Sergius and Bacchus (at the Ukrainian church and center), the Roman Forum, or the Palatine Hill may do so independently. Independent supper. Palatine Hill may do so independently. Sunday, October 10: Today's pilgrimage resumes with solemn holy Mass celebrated by our Chaplains and chanted by the MIC at Trinità dei Pellegrini, church of the the Fraternity of St. Peter in Rome. Later we visit Santa Sabina, headquarters of the Dominican Order in Rome. We'll visit Santa Maria del Priorato, the church of the Knights of Malta and then stroll through the medieval neighborhood of Trastevere, literally "across the Tiber." We'll visit San Franceso a Ripa, home to a magnificent Bernini statue and St. Francis's "pillow." We'll visit Santa Cecilia's Basilica and admire Moderno's sculpture of this saint. After an independent lunch in Trastevere, we will visit San Chrysogono and Santa Maria in Trastevere (where St. Anna Maria Taigi is buried) followed by free time for shopping before our group supper.

Monday, October 11: Today we will see some of the most brilliant and important apse mosaics in Rome, crucial to our understanding of early Christian liturgy. Following Mass at Cosmas and Damien we will stroll up the Esquiline hill and visit Santa Pudenziana built over a home where tradition holds St. Peter offered Mass. Next we'll visit the Church of Santa Prassede, her sister. We'll end our morning at the Basilica Santa Maria Maggiore. After this easy morning, pilgrims will have free time until our group supper.

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Wednesday, October 13: Following breakfast, we transfer to Rome's airport this morning. With a renewed sense of pilgrimage, and an invigorated love of our Catholic faith, we'll board our plane for the return flight home. Godspeedl

Itineraries: Itineraries are prepared and scheduled in advance according to the best information available at the time and are subject to change by the date of the pilgrimage

Pricing: Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. reserves the right to adjust pricing should the following occur; (1) Rise in Airfare due to higher fuel costs, etc. (2) Rise in ground costs due to increases in hotel charges, bus fares, fees, taxes and other costs due to the fluctuating value of the U.S. dollar against foreign currency.

Deposits and final Payments: A deposit of \$450 per person is required to hold your reservation of which \$200 is non-refundable (may be refundable under travel insurance conditions).
